

Epidemic State: Low


There is little recent data on the HIV epidemic in Singapore. However, what data is available indicate that the epidemic is low among high risk groups.

• HIV seroprevalence among sex workers in Singapore ranged from no evidence of infection in 1986-93 to 2 percent in 1994.




 HIV seroprevalence among IV drug users in Singapore ranged from no evidence of infection in the first half of 1992 to less than one-half of 1 percent in 1994.



• Serosurveys carried out among men who have sex with men showed that HIV prevalence fluctuated between 3 and 5 percent between 1987 and 1992 in Singapore.



 HIV seroprevalence among patients seen at STD clinics during 1992 and the first half of 1993 varied little. Prevalence was below 1 percent in both years.
